

1979 approved a two-year program to send at least 200 Rotarian volunteer physicians to Indochinese refugee camps to help ease emergency medical situations and prepare refugee families for resettlement abroad.

The Board appropriated \$600,000 (U.S.) of the 3-H fund to cover travel and living expenses of medical teams at the camps. In December, Dr. W. Grattan O'Connell, 3-H Consultative Group member from New Zealand, and 3-H Program Manager John Stuckey traveled to some of the camps, located primarily in Hong Kong, Thailand, and Malaysia, to observe conditions and establish procedures for the two-year program. They learned that primary-care physicians are needed first, with radiologists, parasitologists, and others experienced in treatment of tropical diseases following in priority.

Requests for volunteers have already been made to district governors and all clubs. The response is encouraging, but many more volunteers are needed.

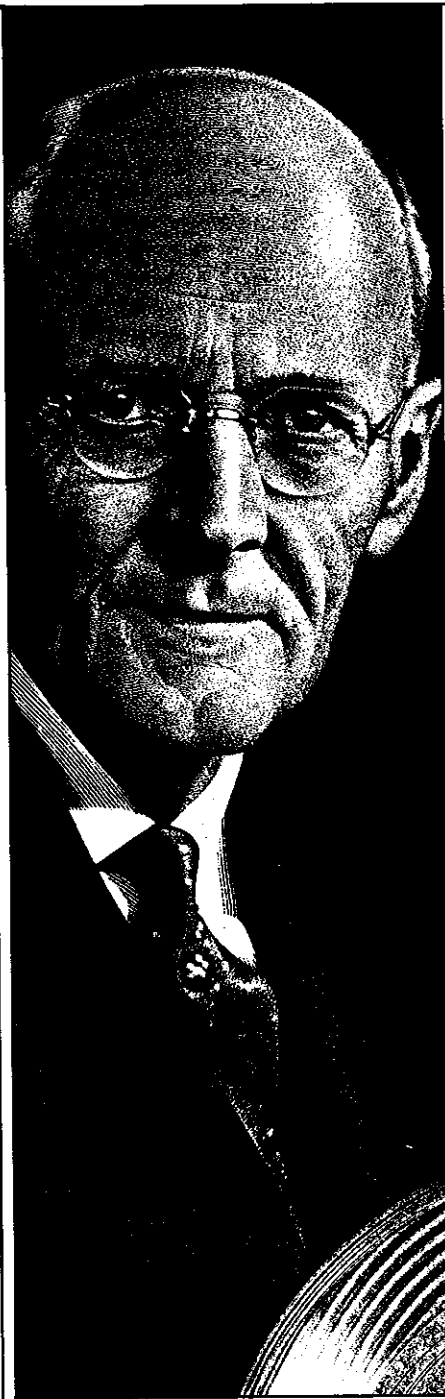

LET PAUL HARRIS SPEAK TO PROSPECTIVE MEMBERS

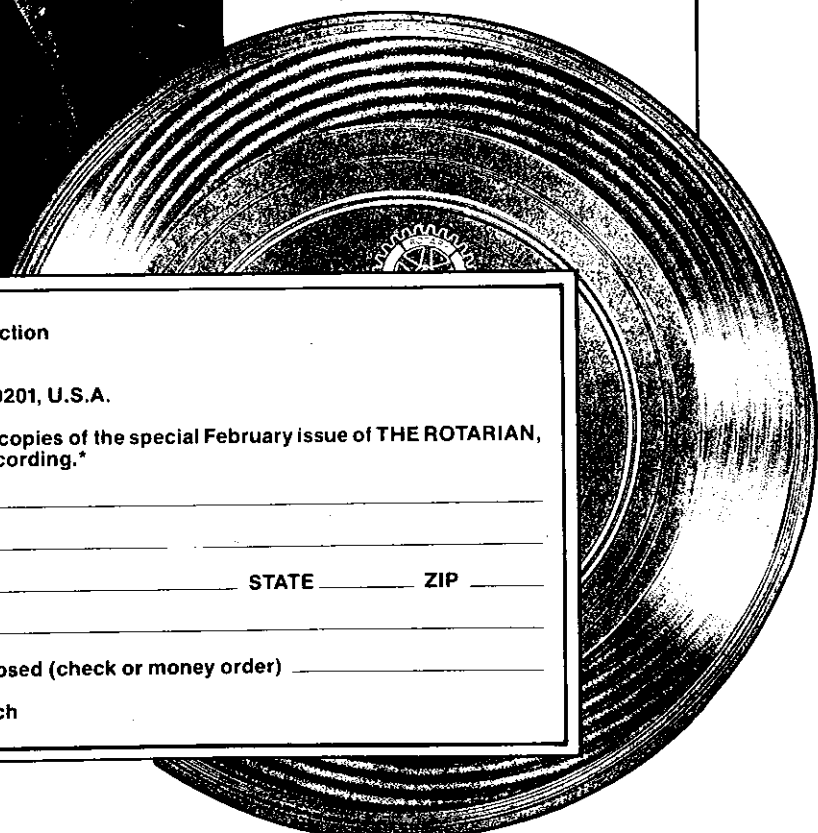
